# About our Strategic Plan

The Gunnison Valley Education Foundation (GVEF) has its origins in Kids Kount, a community-based initiative established in 2003. The <u>Teacher Innovation Grant</u> <u>Program</u> was adopted in the 2013-2014 academic year. Gunnison Valley Education Foundation (GVEF) has raised funds and granted them to the Gunnison Valley Watershed School District (GWSD) to guide the future success and effectiveness of our mission, the Foundation has participated in the Community Foundation of the Gunnison Valley's STEP program to create this Strategic Plan as a roadmap.


The ensuing Strategic Plan is the work of a committee to review and revise our Vision, Mission and Core Beliefs, and identify priority goals. All board members, the school district superintendent, a WSU education professor, and a local parent, participated in the summer (2021) planning sessions, facilitated by Janice Welborn of CFGV. The two primary areas identified for improvement by the group were: 1. Developing community partnerships and 2. Creating a fundraising plan. The plan spans three school years but will be reviewed periodically, at least twice a year.

This plan was adopted on November 4, 2021, by a unanimous vote of the GVEF Board.

# GRANTS

Grants offered by GVEF focus on Teacher Innovation Grants which support the enrichment of educational excellence in the Gunnison Watershed School District (GWSD). This funding supplements innovative instructional programs not currently supported by traditional tax-based revenues. The Education Foundation generates financial resources for granting through donations, fundraisers, and interest from its endowment, to encourage exploration of new and creative learning opportunities. We typically receive 9-15 proposals and fund \$10 - \$15,000 annually. Since the inception of the grant program GVEF has funded over \$100,000 in innovation grants.



- Teacher Innovation Grant awards are available to any Gunnison Watershed School District certificated (non-management) employee.
- Grants of up to \$500 are offered to each teacher-applicant to innovatively explore ways of helping students learn. Teachers are encouraged to work cooperatively on grant projects to increase their total award for the project.
- If a grant has been awarded for the same fundamental project for three consecutive years, that project must sit out one year before requesting a grant again.
- Grant proposals are submitted annually in the spring, and reviewed by a committee consisting of GVEF board members and Gunnison community members.
- The review committee recommends awards to the GVEF Board for approval. The GVEF Board subsequently recommends awards to the board of the Gunnison Valley Community Foundation for their final approval.



# Appendix B



### What are Teacher Innovation Grants?

Gunnison Valley Education Foundation (GVEF) provides grants for teachers in the Gunnison Watershed School District (GWSD) of up to \$500 each to innovatively explore ways of helping students learn.

You may apply to:

- Develop an original teaching idea or new program for use in your classroom which others can adapt and will enrich your core curriculum (may include funds to visit model programs, hire consultants).
- Experiment with ways to solve specific instructional challenges in your classroom.
- Develop a project involving cooperation between you and one or more GWSD teachers. Each teacher in such a cooperative effort is eligible for up to \$500.
- Develop a project that encourages parent and/or community partnerships.
- Develop a project that enhances the school's facility (e.g. visual art, recreation) and benefits students educationally.
- Replicate a proven strategy not yet implemented in the applicant's classroom.

### Who is eligible to apply?

Any GWSD certificated (non-management) employee may apply. If you have been awarded a grant for the same fundamental project for three consecutive years, you must sit out one year before requesting a grant for the same project again.

### GVEF will <u>not</u> fund:

- Projects that have already been completed.
- Projects specifically for marketing and public relations.
- Projects that espouse political or religious views.
- Projects that target specific individuals.
- Projects that are not directly related to classroom curriculum.

### Application Instructions:

The Teacher Innovation Grant application can be accessed and submitted online at <u>GVEF Teacher</u> <u>Innovation Grant Application</u>. The application requires a detailed project description, goals, timeline, budget and a letter of support from a supervising administrator. Applications are due by midnight on Monday, April 11, 2022. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.

**Please be prepared to answer the following questions:** It is recommended that you prepare your responses in a Word document where you can easily edit and get an accurate word count. Then cut-and-paste your responses into the appropriate fields in the online application. Special formatting such as bold text, underlines, numbering or bullet points may not appear the same once they've been pasted into the online application.

### **Detailed Project Information:**

- Project Description:
  - Identify the issue or challenge you are trying to address. (max 75 words)
  - Describe your student population including the number of students impacted and any special needs they might have. (max 75 words)
  - List and describe the goals and intended outcomes of the project. (max 75 words)
  - Summarize the project activities and your anticipated timeline. (max 75 words)
- Innovativeness of Proposal: (max 250 words)
  - How is this project an innovative or creative way to address the challenge you identified in the previous question?
- Method of Project Evaluation: (max 200 words)
  - How will you assess whether this project effectively met its goals and intended outcomes?

#### **Required Attachments:**

- Project Budget Please identify all sources of income for this project (including this grant) and all expenses.
- An Administrative Reference a form signed by a school principal or supervisor

### If funded, what are my responsibilities?

If your application is funded, you are required to submit a **Grant Report** within 30 days of completion of the project, or no later than March 31, 2023 if it is a full-year project. This report can be accessed and submitted online at <u>GVEF Teacher Innovation Grant Application</u> and must include digital photos. *Failure to submit a final report will automatically disqualify you from applying for the Teacher Innovation grant the following year.* 

Please note, all capital purchases made possible by GVEF funds will be considered property of the Gunnison Watershed School District.

### 2022-2023 Teacher Innovation Grant recipients will be notified of awards by May 15, 2022.

### **Grant Policies**

The mission of the Gunnison Valley Education Foundation (GVEF) is to support and advance the Gunnison Watershed School District by raising funds to provide students with an exceptional education that empowers all students to succeed at learning and at life.

As a Designated Fund at the Community Foundation of the Gunnison Valley (the Foundation), GVEF can receive donations according to the Gift Acceptance policy of the Foundation including cash and publicly traded securities. Gifts to GVEF may be Unrestricted, allowing the Foundation Board to determine areas of need or designate funds to specific schools, activities, instructional supplies or special programs.

GVEF uses current best practices in seeking applications for grants in the grant review process and in awarding grants. Complete grant applications must be received electronically at <u>GVEF</u> <u>Teacher Innovation Grant Application</u> by the posted deadline date. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered by the Grant Selection Committee.

The Grant Selection Committee consists of two GVEF Board Members and three members of the community. This committee is responsible for submitting recommendations to GVEF's Board of Directors for preliminary approval. Through an impartial process, the committee will determine the merits of the request; any committee member connected in any way to the requesting

program or with a child in a class of a teacher making a request, will be excused from participation in discussions or recommendations concerning that particular request. The Foundation Board of Directors will review the recommendations of the GVEF Board of Directors and make the final decision on the recommendations.

All awarded monies will be paid to the Gunnison Watershed School District for distribution to grant recipients.

All grant recipients must report on the expenditure of grant funds and results of the project upon completion, and in no case, later than the application deadline for the next grant cycle. A report form is available at <u>GVEF Teacher Innovation Grant Application</u>. Without reports on prior grants, applicants will be ineligible for future grant cycles. Any funds not spent for the specific purpose of the awarded grant must be returned to GVEF and cannot be diverted to other uses without the express approval of the Foundation's Board of Directors.

The Gunnison Valley Education Foundation will prioritize the funding of Teacher Innovation Grants based upon the applicant's ability to develop, implement and share creative teaching strategies that benefit students. The Grant Selection Committee will consider applications that either generate new ideas or replicate proven strategies. The primary criterion for funding decisions will always be that which most benefits students.
